- 6. What's wrong? Are you feeling okay today?
 - I don't know. I just don't **feel like myself** today. (... I just don't **feel myself** today)
- 7. To pass this course, you'll need to **apply yourself** a lot more.
- 8. ... I finally **feel like myself** again. (... I finally **feel myself** again.)
