- 2. **2.1:** Moving slowly because of the darkness, the survivors moved from room to room looking for a way out.
 - **2.2:** The survivors moved slowly because of the darkness. They moved from room to room looking for a way out.
- 3. **3.1:** Indian Pulitzer Prize winner Adnan Abdi has been documenting the protests in his hometown.
- 4. 4.1: Panda bears survive on a very limited diet of bamboo, eating up to 84 pounds of it per day.
 - **4.2:** Surviving on a very limited diet, panda bears eat up to 84 pounds of only bamboo per day.
